

Kelly Marie Chin is an Associate Professor of Medicine at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center, Dallas, TX, USA, where she serves as the Director of the Pulmonary Hypertension Program and as the Medical Director for the University Hospital Heart and Lung Clinic. She received her medical degree and completed Internal Medicine residency training and a Master of Science in Clinical Sciences degree at UT Southwestern, and completed a fellowship in Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine at the University of California, San Diego. Her research and clinical interests are focused on pulmonary hypertension, and she has served as a principal investigator, steering committee member and adjudication committee member for many major pulmonary hypertension clinical trials.
